Recycling Programs



Batteries - Household batteries and cellphones can be taken to a number of locations in Cumberland County. For a drop off location near you visit www.call2recycle.ca

Construction & Demolition (C&D) - C&D (wood, gyproc, windows, etc.) can be taken to the Cumberland Central Landfill.

Electronics - Bring select end of life electronics to an EPRA drop-off centre free of charge. Visit www.epra.ca for drop off locations near you.

Household Hazardous Waste - HHW can be disposed of at free events held by Cumberland Joint Services. Call 902-667-5141 or 1-888-711-5925 for more information.

Paint - Leftover paint can be taken to any ENVIRO-DEPOT™ - free of charge.

Safe Sharps Program - Free sharps containers are available at pharmacies. Syringes, lancets, and needles go into the containers which can then be taken back to the pharmacy for disposal.

Scrap Metal - Scrap metal can be taken to the Cumberland Central Landfill for recycling.

Textiles - Visit www.afterwear.ca for drop off locations near you.

Tires - Up to 4 vehicle tires can be returned to any tire retailer at any one time.

Waste Oil - Retailers that sell motor oil must either accept used oil or provide a drop-off location within 5kms of the original purchase site.

Helpful Reminders!

Reminders!

- ♦ Garbage must be placed in clear non coloured bags. Black bags are not accepted at the Cumberland Central Landfill.
- ♦ Organics can be placed in paper or compostable bags within the green cart. A great alternative to using bags is to use boxboard (cereal boxes) to contain your food scraps. NO plastic/biodegradable plastic in the green cart.
- ♦ At home make sure your material is out on time and placed no more than 3m from the curb.
- ♦ Wrapping paper, tissue paper, and styrofoam are garbage.
- ♦ Paper towel and Kleenex should be placed in the green cart.
- ♦ Paper recyclables must be in separate bags from container recyclables.
